This two-hour presentation will introduce attendees to the legal requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act (504) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) as they apply to K-12 public school students and post-secondary school students. The presentation will explain how IDEA and 504/ADA overlap, and how a student who has an IEP does not give up his or her rights under 504/ADA.

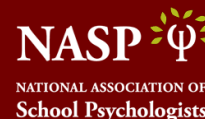
